Parent Code of Conduct Policy

Purpose and scope

Our school is invested in supporting the very best possible relational health between:

Parent and child

Child and child

Child and school staff

Parents and school staff

In April 2024 a parent group met to discuss the school's ethos and its focus on developing positive relationships, to create a parent code of conduct.

At Colcot Primary School, we believe that it is important to:

- -Work in partnership with parents to support their child's development
- -Create a safe, respectful and inclusive environment for pupils, staff and parents
- -Model appropriate behaviour for our pupils at all times

This code of conduct aims to help the school work together with parents/carers by setting guidelines on appropriate behaviour at our school.

Our expectations of parents/carers:

- -We expect parents/carers and other visitors to:
- -Respect the ethos, vision and values of the school
- -Work together with school staff in the best interests of the children
- -Treat all member school community with respect
- -Correct their child's behaviours where it could lead to conflict, aggression or unsafe conduct
- -Seek a peaceful solution to any issues
- -Calmly approach the right member of staff to help solve any issues of concern
- -Communicate with the school regarding matters concerning their children

Unacceptable behaviours from parents/carers:

- -Swearing, or using offensive language around the children/on our premises please keep conversations child friendly
- -Speaking aggressively, displaying a temper, or shouting at members of staff, pupils or other parents
- -Using aggressive or threatening behaviour towards another child or adult
- -Posting defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments about the school and/or its staff or pupils on social media platforms please come and speak to us if you have any issues or concerns that you would like addressed
- -Disciplining another person's child please bring any concerns about other children to a member or staff
- -Smoking or drinking alcohol on school premises
- -Possessing or taking drugs (including legal highs)
- -Bringing dogs onto the school premises (unless a guide dog)

Breaching the Code of Conduct:

If the school suspects, or becomes aware, that a parent breaches the school code of conduct, the school will gather information from those involved and speak to individuals about the incident.

Depending on the incident the school may then:

- -send a letter to the parent/carer reminding them that we expect all adults within our school community to model appropriate behaviours for our children to learn.
- -Invite the parent/carer into school to speak to the headteacher or a senior member of staff about the incident
- -Contact the appropriate authorities (in the case of criminal behaviour)
- -Seek legal advice regarding further action in cases of conduct that may be libellous or slanderous
- -Ban the parent from the school premises

The school will always attempt to manage breakdown in relationship/incidents restoratively and in a proportionate way. The headteacher will decide upon an appropriate response to poor behaviour from parents/carers. The headteacher will consult with the school's Chair of Governors before banning a parent/carer from the school premises.
